Indian Academy of Medical Sciences invites young (below 40 years) biomedical scientists to submit papers of their unpublished work in any field of biomedicine for presentation at the Scientific Session of the Academy in November/December 1971. The best paper will be awarded Dr. S.S. Misra's Gold Medal from Dr. Misra's Endowment Fund of the Academy. Other scientists will be awarded certificate of merit.

2. Through the courtesy of Sir Shriram Foundation, the Academy will award Sir Sriram Gold Medal for the best published paper during the preceding three years on any clinical subject. The work should have been done in India by any biomedical scientists of any age.

- The scientist should not have received any prize for the same paper in the past.
- Four copies of each paper should reach Executive Director latest by 30th Sept. 1971.
- Selected papers may be published in the Annals of the Academy.
- The selected scientists will be invited, at the cost of Academy, to present their papers at the Scientific Session of the Academy.
- The awards (Medals and certificates) will be formally presented at the time of Convocation next day.
